## Professorship (W 2) of Media Cultures in North American and British Studies

Potential candidates must show significant expertise in the area of media cultures in both teaching and research. Based on a broad definition of media, we expect candidates to approach media, including print media, social media, and audio-visual media, from a critical cultural studies point of view in teaching and research and to work at the intersection of media and cultural studies discourses. Moreover, successful candidates must have a focus on Anglo-American literary and cultural studies.

We expect candidates to have an interest in teaching methodology and a willingness to collaborate with the Center for Teacher Education on developing students' media competence in the areas of "media and life" and "media and subject." Furthermore, the candidate's teaching will actively contribute to all study programs (teaching degree program, MA North American Studies, and all BA programs).

Moreover, collaboration in research and teaching with the Marburg Center for Digital Culture and Infrastructure and contributions to research activities of the institute and the department are desirable. Successful acquisition of third-party funding and an interest in gender studies are expected.
